6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The University designs curriculum for the different courses. While doing so University invites feedback from the faculty members. Faculty of the college gives feedback to the Board of Studies (BOS) of University which is considered for the curriculum design

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Student centric teaching methods were adopted. Also the emphasis is given on ICT enabled teaching methodologies. Organised seminars and group discussions programme for the students in the class rooms.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examinations are conducted by the university but to prepare the students for the university examinations we arrange tests in the class rooms. As per university guidelines there is Central Assessment Programme (CAP) system for the evaluation. There is a provision of reevaluation as per the demands of the students. Also university provides photocopy of the answer sheets whenever demanded by the students

6.3.4 Research and Development

As per the suggestions of IQAC and Research Recommendation committee, faculty members motivate the students to undertake the research projects at their level. Students are also promoted to prepare research posters and participate in Avishkar, Research competition of the University. Faculty members are motivated to prepare research papers and publish them in national/International conferences and seminars. Total 12 research papers were published in international journals and 04 papers were published in national level research journals. Total 35 research papers were presented in national / international conferences / seminars.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has separate building for library which contains 53, 924 books including reference books and text books. The Computer laboratory has more than 60 computers for better use of ICT in the academic as well as administration. The Department of Physics has Research Recognised Laboratory. There are 18 classrooms and 13 laboratories. Sports: Separate Gymkhana Building, 8 lane athletic track of 400 meters, Kho-Kho ground, Kabaddi ground, Football ground, Handball ground and Cricket pitch. A new building of 7000 sq. feet worth of Rs. 89,00,000/- is constructed for chemistry laboratories. In addition to this, the first floor of the same building used for Botany, Zoology, Mathematics and Statistics laboratories is constructed of 7000 sq. feet worth of Rs. 1 Crore. A 400 meter long RCC compound wall is constructed around the college premises to secure the college property. The 400 meter running track is safeguarded by RCC walls on either sides of the track.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The management of the Sanstha has an effective mechanism of human resource management. The management has 22 degree colleges and faculty members are transferred as per the requirements of the colleges for the optimum use of human resources. They are also transferred for their convenience according to their family problems

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Parents Feedback Analysis

A structured questionnaire has been supplied to the sampled parents on random basis. The responses so collected through questionnaire were classified and tabulated. Based on the average highest response the conclusions were drawn and following are the conclusions.

- 1) Adequate educational facilities are provided in the institute
- 2) Qualified and competent teachers are available
- 3) Eco-friendly and clean college campus
- 4) Public transport facilities are available as per college schedule
- 5) Teacher-parent meet organized regularly by the college
- 6) Suggestions from the parents are considered positively by the college
- 7) Library services are properly provided to the wards by the college
- 8) Adequate exposure is given to the students regarding co-curricular and extra curricular activities
- 9) The overall personality of the ward is developed in the college
- 10) ICT is used for effective and fast communication by the college

Students Feedback Analysis

A structured statement schedule has been supplied to the sampled students from three streams on random basis. The statements were classified in three broad categories, viz (i) general information covering 13 statements, (ii) subject related questions covering 12 statements, (iii) institutional and aim of educational related 06 statements. Students were asked to respond the statements on 5 points scale covering 1 = Not satisfactory, 2 = Satisfactory, 3 = Good, 4 = Very Good and 5 = Excellent. The responses so collected through structured schedule were classified and tabulated. Based on the average highest response to the teachers on each statement under a category, the highest average regarding the responses to the statements have been considered for the conclusions. Thus conclusions were drawn which are as below.

- (i) **General information**: Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.15 which means the most of the teachers are very good in general information.
- (ii) **Subject related statements**: Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.52 which means th most of the teachers are very good in their respected subjects.
- (iii) **Institutional and aim of educational related**: Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.23 which means the most of the teachers are very good in providing institutional information and aim of education.
