



## **Alumni Feedback Analysis**

A structured questionnaire has been supplied to the sampled alumni on random basis. The responses so collected through questionnaire were classified and tabulated. Based on the average highest response the conclusions were drawn. The analysis of the feedback from alumni and the description thereof is as below.

The 92% alumni responded that the college organizes alumni meet at least once in a year. Some streams organizes alumni meet. 52% alumni responded that qualified and competent teachers are available. Due to government policy there is no recruitment of teachers and the vacant posts are filled on clock hour basis.

Regarding adequate educational facilities in the college 78% respondents positively. 80% respondents opined positively that college campus is maintained clean and eco-friendly. There is no availability of public transport facility to the wards to attend the college as per schedule. 65% alumni reported that the suggestions made by alumni are considered by the college and efforts are made to implement. Library services are properly provided to the wards. 95% alumni responded that exposure to the students regarding co curricular and extra co curricular activities adequately. All the respondents responded positively regarding the efforts made by the college for the overall personality development of the students. Only 20% alumni responded that ICT is used in teaching learning process.

# **Parents Feedback Analysis**

A structured questionnaire has been supplied to the sampled parents on random basis. The responses so collected through questionnaire were classified and tabulated. The analysis of feedback from the parents is made on the average highest response to the questions and the percentage of such response is drawn. Where, the response to a particular question is over and above 50%, the generalisation is made and conclusions were drawn.

Based on the responses of the parents 100% parents responded that the college has its vision, mission and goal and the college is functioning with the set vision and mission and tries to meet the goal.

All the respondents positively responded regarding admission process implemented by the college for the various programmes, because admissions are given on merit and rules framed by university and government.

91% respondents responded positively regarding the availability of infrastructural facilities available to meet the needs of the students. Co curricular and extracurricular activities are conducted, response to this by the parents amounted 80%.

100% parents responded positively regarding the facilities such as government scholarships, free ships are made available by the college.

All the parents responded 100% regarding the cell and committees like, anti ragging cell, discipline committee, placement cell, equal opportunity cell, standing committee, internal complaint committee are actively working in the college.

98% parents responded positively regarding the teaching learning process in the college, the conduct of examination and the evaluation of student's performance through various tests.

All the parents responded that there is no public transport facility available to the students from town to the location of the college.

# **Students Feedback Analysis**

A structured statement schedule has been supplied to the sampled students from three streams on random basis. The statements were classified in three broad categories, viz (i) general information covering 13 statements, (ii) subject related questions covering 12 statements, (iii) institutional and aim of educational related 06 statements. Students were asked to respond the statements on 5 points scale covering 1 = Not satisfactory, 2 = Satisfactory, 3 = Good, 4 = Very Good and 5 = Excellent. The responses so collected through structured schedule were classified and tabulated. Based on the average highest response to the teachers on each statement under a category, the highest average regarding the responses to the statements have been considered for the conclusions. Thus conclusions were drawn which are as below.

(i) **General information**: Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.05 which means the most of the teachers are very good in general information.

(ii) **Subject related statements**: Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.63 which means the most of the teachers are very good in their respected subjects.

(iii) **Institutional information and aim of education related statements:** Majority of the teachers were rated by the students at 4.38 which mean the most of the teachers are very good in providing institutional information and aim of education.
