National Commission for Women, New Delhi

The National Commission for Women was set up a statutory body in January 1992 under the National Commission for Women Act, 1990(Act No. 20 of 1990 of Govt. Of India) to review the Constitutional and legal safeguards for women; recommend remedial legislative measures, facilitate redressal of grievances and advise the Government on all policy matters affecting women. The committee on the Status of Women in India (CSWI) recommended nearly two decades ago, the setting up of a National Commission for women to fulfil the surveillance functions to facilities redressal of grievances and to accelerate the socio-economic development of women.
